### Get ready for Tiger Run 2014 and the 50th Anniversary of the Pontiac GTO!

**NEW CHANGES**: We recently conducted a respond-by-vote survey, the results being that we are changing the specific days of Tiger Run. After tallying votes, the final count showed that 65% of those answering the survey voted to have Tiger Run on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, with Sunday available for an extra activity. Read on.

Tiger Run 2014 will be on June 19-20-21 – Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Be sure you have the dates correct when making reservations at the host hotel. Thursday the 19th will be registration and cruise-in to the Pilot Butte Drive-In, Friday the 20th will be the car show and Awards Banquet, and Saturday the 21st will be drag racing in Madras. We will be planning an extra activity for Sunday the 22nd, such as a cruise around the Bend area, maybe to Sisters, Oregon, or other type of activity.

The new Tiger Run host hotel is the Shilo Inn Suites Hotel in Bend, located at 3105 O.B. Riley Rd. – next to the Bend Riverhouse, which was our 2013 host hotel. For host hotel Shilo Inn reservations in Bend, the phone number is 541-389-9600. **Note:** We have negotiated a room rate of either \$117 per night or \$129 per night, plus tax\* (see below), depending on the type of room you request. The Shilo, located on the banks of the Deschutes River, is a full service hotel and restaurant. There are over 140 rooms available for our group, and each room overlooks either the Deschutes River, or the outdoor pool and fountain. And, a full hot breakfast is included each morning for hotel guests! Each room also includes a micorwave oven, refrigerator, coffee maker, and other amenities. The Shilo also has indoor and outdoor pools, a spa, sauna, steam room, fitness center and guest laundry facilities. Of course, there are additional room charges for such items as extra guests over the room limit, rollaway beds, pets and so forth. Check with the hotel for extra amenities charges. The Shilo will also be our hotel and caterer for the Tiger Run Awards Banquet. We are also contracting for the Shilo Inn to be our 2015 Tiger Run host hotel, as their room rates will rise only 3% over 2014 rates. We hope you will be able to join us for Tiger Run 2014, and help celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Pontiac GTO!

### The Pontiac - A Story of Trial and Error

Did you know we have Cadillac to thank for the birth of Pontiac. Actually, we have many people to thank for the birth of Pontiac, but the story begins with two gentlemen – Edward Murphy and Alanson Brush.

Murphy was the founder of Pontiac Buggy Company in Pontiac, Michigan which produced horse-drawn carriages, and was looking to evolve into the automotive age. Brush, who was responsible for the design of early Cadillacs, later became an engineering consultant in Detroit. When the two met in 1906, Brush showed Murphy his design for a small two-cylinder car that Cadillac had rejected. Murphy bought Brush's automotive idea, and decided it should carry the name "Oakland" as did his horse-drawn vehicles.

During the summer of 1907, Murphy organized the Oakland Motor Car Co. His lack of sales with the Oakland, a two cylinder vertical engine that rotated counterclockwise, convinced him that Cadillac might have been right in rejecting the Brush design. In 1909, a line of 40-hp four-cylinder cars with sliding-gear transmissions was introduced, and more successful. Unfortunately, Edward Murphy didn't see the increased sales due to his sudden death in 1908.

Shortly before his passing, Murphy had met with another former buggy man named William C. Durant. Soon afterwards, Oakland became part of Durant's General Motors Empire and its design would evolve under his rule. Oaklands most recognized model was produced in 1924, the "True Blue Oakland Six" which came with a new L-head engine, four-wheel brakes, centralized controls and an automatic spark advance, and painted with a Blue Duco nitro-cellulose lacquer.

In 1926, Alfred R. Glancy, Oakland's assistant general manager introduced the Pontiac - a quality six cylinder engine car designed to sell for the price of a four. This new "companion" car to the Oakland was an instant success and Pontiac had been born!
